
A Solarplate Master Class with Dan Welden

What is Solarplate?

- Developed by Dan Welden in the 1970's
- Simple approach to intaglio and relief
- Safer than traditional etching
- No acid or dangerous chemicals
- Light-sensitive polymer surface on a steel backing
- Produces a fine print



Dan is an innovator at the forefront of the alternative health and safety oriented movement of printmaking, and the originator of a technique called Solarplate. He co-authored, *Printmaking in the Sun*, a comprehensive manual of Solarplate methods. Dan also produced an instructional film by the same name. He has over 50 years of artmaking experience and exhibited in 80 solo and 700 group exhibitions spanning five continents. Additionally, his work is in many public and private collections. As the director of Hampton Editions, Lts., of Sag Harbor, Long Island, he has collaborated with many well-established artists.

As a teacher, Dan continues to inspire students around the world in workshops, demonstrating how to make Solarplates, printing in intaglio and relief plates, using the safer, greener methods of Solarplate etching. He is a past-president of the Society of American Graphic Artists, and has done demonstrations at the New York State Art Teacher's Association, Southern Graphics Council, and Mid-America Print Council conferences.
